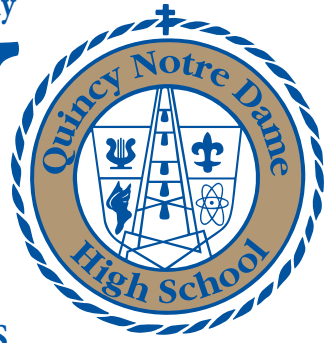

tunity. QND is very appreciative of the hard work and dedication by George Scholz and the Class of 1970 committee. QND is blessed to have such great alumni support which keeps Raider Pride alive and well," said Kurt Stuckman, QND Foundation Executive Director. The dividends from the scholarship will be used for tuition assistance allowing future QND students to receive a Catholic and Christian secondary education.

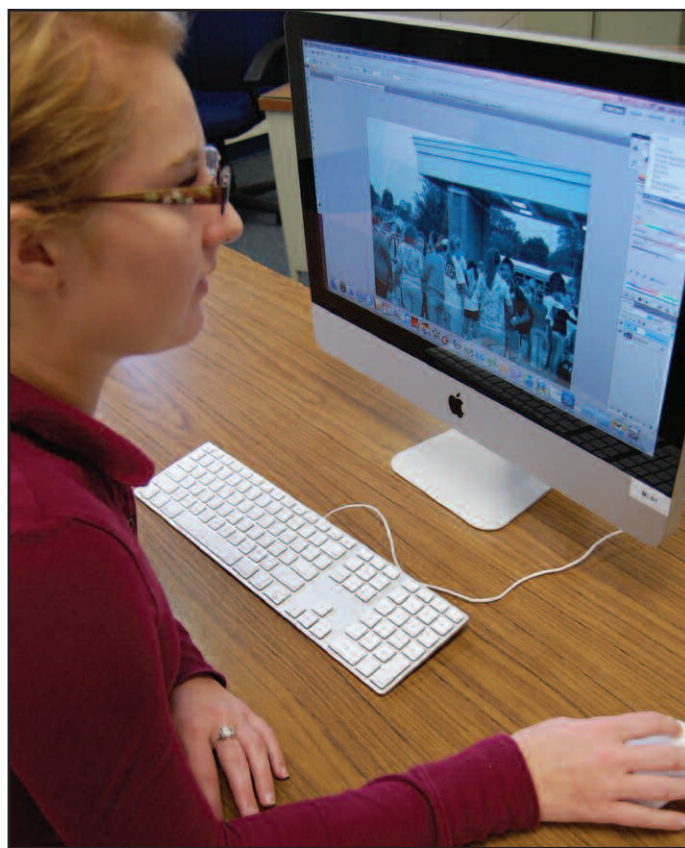

Students will also become familiar with the powerful software available which will aid their creativity while learning the technical skills to launch them toward careers in advertising design, digital illustration, web design, and desktop publishing.

THE QND AND QCES FOUNDATION PLAN TO LAUNCH "EVERYBODY WINS" MEGA RAFFLE IN SPRING 2011

The Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools Foundation and the Quincy Notre Dame Foundation plan to kick off a major fundraising initiative in April 2011. With support from the four Catholic parishes and the five Catholic schools, the two foundations will conduct a "mega raffle," selling 4,000 tickets at \$100 each with a grand prize of \$100,000. Numerous other cash prizes, including a car, will be awarded throughout the raffle.

The goal of the raffle is to raise \$200,000 to be divided equally between the two foundations to assist them in their missions to provide financial support to Quincy's five Catholic Schools.
