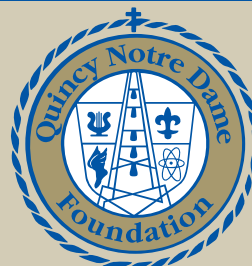

ILLINOIS STATE SCHOLARS

Quincy Notre Dame Principal Mark McDowell announced that 13 students from the graduating class of 2016 have been recognized as Illinois State Scholars. The prestigious award, given annually by the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC), recognized nearly 19,000 high school students from across the state as this year's State Scholars. Winners rank in the top ten percent of high school seniors from 652 high schools throughout the state. Selection is based on a combination of exemplary ACT or SAT scores and class rank at the end of junior year. High school guidance counselors work in conjunction with ISAC to determine the winners.

QND MEDIEVAL DAY

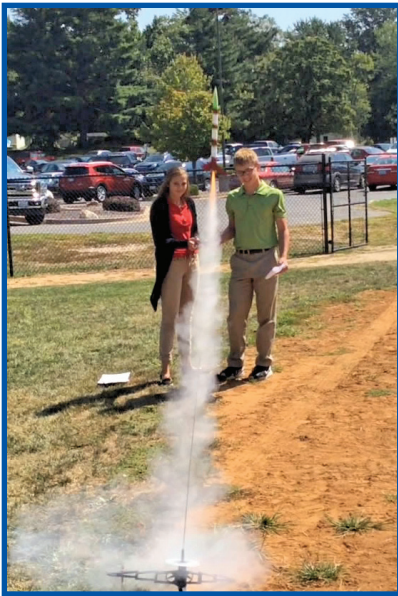

QND's Haley Haugh (junior) qualified for the Class 1A State Tournament and tied for 50th.

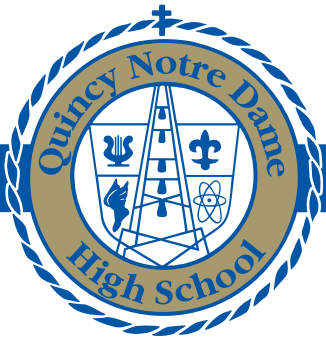
