#### **WEATHER RELATED DELAYS AND**



With the winter season fast approaching, I wanted to remind you of our protocol for handling school cancelations, early dismissals, and delayed starts. As always,

when the weather necessitates a change in our plans, we will inform you through both *FACTS SIS* and the local media. We have three typical scenarios:

- 1) Canceling school entirely based on current or predicted weather
- 2) Letting out of school early based on current or predicted weather
- 3) Delaying the start of school two hours based on current or predicted weather

On a two hour delay, we simply delay the start of school from 7:45 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. And while our day would begin later, it would end at our normal 2:15 p.m. dismissal time. On these days the school will open at 9:00 a.m. Students who arrive before 9:15 would remain in the gym until being dismissed to their 1<sup>st</sup> hour classes. On days that we have two hour delays, all

before school activities will be cancelled (band, etc.). Decisions regarding after school activities will be made during the course of the day.



#### **MORE INFORMATION ON INCLEMENT WEATHER –**

Large snow or ice storms may necessitate the closing of schools. We will notify parents via phone by utilizing our FACTS SIS Parent Alert System. We also encourage parents and guardians to watch the television or listen to the radio if you think Quincy schools may be closed. If the Quincy Public School System closes for inclement weather, the Quincy Catholic grade schools and Quincy Notre Dame High School automatically cancel classes that day.

## **FROM DEAN OF STUDENTS – Bill Connell**

#### **WEATHER RELATED RULES:**

With winter weather approaching, please speak with your son/daughter about a couple of weather-related rules. At no time should snowballs be thrown on school property. Also, no one should be driving on the parking lot more than 5-10 miles an hour when ice or snow is on the pavement. Crowded conditions and people coming in and out of the parking lot make safety a key concern at all times, but especially during winter weather times.

#### DRESS CODE:

We are appreciative of the parental support that we have received during the first nine weeks of school regarding the implementation of the dress code. Please make sure when your student leaves from home to go to school, their clothing meets our dress code requirements. If your son or daughter has any questions on a specific piece of apparel, please have them ask before wearing the article of clothing in question to school.

During the regular school day, <u>QND</u> sweatshirts and <u>QND</u> jackets (<u>without hoods</u>) are permitted. In addition, fleece pullovers and ½ zip pullovers are permitted if they are navy blue, Vegas gold, white, gray, or a combination of these colors and <u>have the QND logo visible</u>. <u>No other sweatshirts or jackets are allowed</u>.

\*If a student has a specific question about whether or not clothing item is acceptable, he or she should speak with the Dean of Students for clarification.

Should a student have an existing jacket or sweatshirt that is consistent with the parameters outlined above, he or she <u>must have the QND logo on his/her jacket or sweatshirt for it to comply with our dress code</u>. #### DISCIPLINE

Detention will be held Tuesday and Thursday from 2:30 to 3:30 p.m. In School Suspension (ISS) will be held as needed. Please talk with your child about proper behavior, moral decisions, and the consequences of bad choices - and more important, the positive dividends of good choices!

#### ATTENDANCE/TARDY POLICY

Daily attendance at school by each student is required; it is essential to the student's ability to learn and the overall quality of education received. School attendance is also important to future employers and college admissions officers who use attendance records as a means of determining an applicant's dependability and good citizenship.

<u>Tardiness</u> — Being on time is a lifelong skill that will help students both now and in their future. Students should make every effort to be on time to school. Failure to arrive on time can result in disciplinary action. Tardies are accumulated by semester. Rules regarding tardiness are as follows:

First Period: A student is considered tardy if he or she is not in first period by 7:45 a.m. If a student is late for school, he or she must report to the Attendance Office upon arrival. A student arriving after 10:15 a.m. would considered ½ day absent. NOTE: IN ORDER **PARTICIPATE** IN SCHOOL RELATED Α EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY ON A DAY WHEN SCHOOL IS IN SESSION, A STUDENT MUST BE IN SCH00L 10:15 BY A.M.

#### FROM OUR ATTENDANCE OFFICE

Please contact Mrs. Frericks in the Attendance Office at 217-223-2479 x 301 or email her at <a href="mailto:cfrericks@quincynotredame.org">cfrericks@quincynotredame.org</a> if your student is ill or has any COVID-19 symptom(s) listed below and will not be participating in school or if they will be remote on an in-person day.

### It is extremely important to give Mrs. Frericks the specific symptom(s) your student is experiencing.

There are three options if a student as **1 or more symptoms related to Covid-19**:

- Get Covid testing and remain at home until results come back
- Get an evaluation/released by your healthcare provider
- Remain on remote learning for 10 days

According guidance from the ACHD and IDPH, we are expected to send students home or deny entry (and provide remote instruction); if **ANY** of the following symptoms are present:

- Fever (100.4 F or higher)
- headache
- shortness of breath
- cough
- sore throat
- vomiting
- diarrhea

- abdominal pain
- congestion
- new loss of sense of taste/smell
- nausea
- fatigue
- muscle or body aches

With all the new guidelines in place this year, the more information you can provide, the easier the attendance process will be. Thank you for your cooperation.

# **Placement Test for Incoming Freshmen**

The QND Placement Test for 8th graders will be administered the week of November 16, 2020, at the individual Parochial Elementary Schools during the school day. # **ACT Planning and Preparation**

Students often ask when and how many times they should take college admissions tests. There is no limit to the amount of times students can test and colleges will accept the highest scores. Parents often ask how students might be better prepared. ACT and SAT provide a practice test for students on-line. QND purchased on on-line Magoosh ACT Prep program that is available to students. Juniors have already created an account in English class. If other students would like to create an account, please contact Mr. Sheffield. There are also individual computer-based programs available through various sources at a reasonable cost. Further information is available through the Guidance Office. The next ACT test is offered on December 12, 2020. The deadline to apply is November 6, 2020. Go to www.actstudent.org to register online. The cost is \$55.00.

### **Scholarship Information**

Seniors applying for financial aid should know the search for aid is an ongoing process rather than a one-time effort. In addition to the scholarship information available on the Internet, students may wish to access a large data base such as www.fastweb.com Students are encouraged to monitor the QND Scholarship Update that lists available local scholarships. This update is emailed directly to every senior periodically.

### **FAFSA Completion**

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) which accesses state and federal grants may be completed after October 1, 2020, and can be linked to the 2019 taxes. Students are encouraged to apply for a FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov and complete the FAFSA at FAFSA.gov as soon as possible. See Mr. Sheffield for more information.


