Applications will also be available for students to pick up in the Guidance office and QND Foundation office.

All scholarship applications are due back to the Foundation office **(except Town & Country Bank Midwest Scholarship) no later than March 1, 2019.**

For Current Seniors to be used for college:

Raider Pride Award Presented in Memory of Roy & Verda Klues and Family, Dorothy Schlipman Memorial Scholarship, Town & Country Bank Midwest Scholarship, Laura (Schuering) Henke Nursing Scholarship, Timothy L. Haley Scholarship, Jill (Hull) Kelly Nursing Scholarship, and Laura Beth Rokita Art Scholarship.

Raider Pride Award Presented in Memory of Roy & Verda Klues and Family

Two of the strongest supporters of Quincy Notre Dame High School were Roy & Verda Klues. Their son, Mr. Jack Klues, an alumnus of QND, wishes to honor his parents for providing Catholic secondary education for him and to honor his parents for being devoted fans of anything connected with QND.



Mr. Klues will provide two (2) \$5,000 scholarships, one for a graduating young lady and one for a graduating young man. This money is to be used for educational endeavors after graduation from Quincy Notre Dame.

The focus of this scholarship is to honor two graduates who possess exceptional school loyalty, exhibit involvement in extracurricular activities, and attend a variety of QND activities. The two recipients should be considered true fans of all things involving the QND Raiders.

Dorothy Schlipman Memorial Scholarship

This \$200 scholarship is presented in memory of Dorothy Schlipman by her family. A permanent plaque will be kept in the school and each recipient's name and date will be engraved on it each year.

Criteria: Consideration given to any college bound senior who has demonstrated school spirit, strong moral character, outgoing personality, friendly demeanor, and admiration from peers. These attributes best exemplified Dorothy Schlipman.



Town & Country Bank Midwest Scholarship

This \$500 scholarship is presented by Town & Country Bank Midwest to assist one senior towards college.

Criteria: Consideration given to any college bound senior. Special emphasis put on extracurricular involvement, leadership positions, awards and honors. This scholarship requires an application and an essay.

Laura (Schuering) Henke Nursing Scholarship

This scholarship honors Laura (Schuering) Henke with her dedication and hard work she put forth in her profession of nursing. Laura graduated from Quincy Notre Dame High School in 1977. One (1) \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating QND senior planning to go into nursing as a career.



Applicant Qualifications:

- 1) Minimum cumulative 3.0 grade point average
- 2) Will attend a four-year college or university and pursue a major in the area of nursing.
- 3) Complete and submit application to the QND Scholarship Committee

Timothy L. Haley Scholarship

This scholarship has been established to honor the life and legacy of Timothy Haley. Timothy was a standout athlete and 2009 graduate of Quincy Notre Dame. He attended and played baseball at John Wood Community College and Quincy University. He was a Corrections Officer in Mt. Sterling and most recently in Pinckneyville. Timothy was a tremendously caring and loving man, who had a deep affection for his family. The Haley and Grawe families have been long time supporters of Quincy Notre Dame and will award one (1) \$500 scholarship in his memory.



Applicant Qualifications:

- 1) A 3 sport athlete who plans to play a collegiate sport
- 2) A student who has a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher

A pool of candidates will be assembled by the QND Guidance Department and provided to the family for selection. **No application is required.**

Jill (Hull) Kelly Nursing Scholarship

This scholarship was established as a result of Jill's passion for nursing. Nursing continues to be a growing integral role in healthcare. The goal of this scholarship is to assist and encourage a QND senior students in their pursuit of a nursing degree.

All scholarship applicants must adhere to the following criteria in order to be considered:

- 1) Have a 3.2 cumulative GPA
- 2) Be a current QND senior
- 3) Plan to attend a 4-year college/university to obtain a bachelor's degree in nursing.

Secondary scholarship consideration:

- 1) Students who will be pursuing a degree in the healthcare field. For example, but not limited to:
 - a) Pharmacy
 - b) Radiology
 - c) Physical Therapy

One (1) \$350 scholarship will be awarded.

For Current Juniors to be used for QND tuition and for Current Seniors to be used for college:

Laura Beth Rokita Art Scholarship

This scholarship was established to memorialize Laura Rokita, a talented artist. Laura was a 2007 graduate of QND where she loved and excelled in the area of art.



This award is given to current QND junior or senior art students to be used for QND or college tuition. Applicants must be, at minimum, 2 year art students planning to major in art or graphic design in college. No G.P.A. restrictions apply.

Two (2) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded.

For Current Juniors to be used for QND tuition:

Thomas E. McElyea Scholarship, Dittmeyer-McElyea Scholarship, John A. Spring Award for Excellence Presented by the Western Catholic Union, and Judy & Rick Haugh Merit Scholarship.

Thomas E. McElyea Scholarship

Thomas E. McElyea graduated with the CBHS Class of 1968, received BS Mechanical Engineering degree from University of Missouri-Rolla (Missouri School of Science and Technology) and received Master of Engineering degree from Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas. After a 41-year career as Licensed Engineer in Texas and Louisiana, Mr. McElyea retired from Sid Richardson Carbon and Energy Company as Director of Engineering.

Three (3) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded. Preference shall be given to students pursuing coursework for a college science major.

Dittmeyer-McElyea Scholarship

This scholarship is a memorial to Edward J. and Celia (Lammers) Dittmeyer; their children Celia K. (Dittmeyer) Aull, Judge Edward B. Dittmeyer and Mrs. John (Joyce B. Dittmeyer) McElyea; and their grandson Thomas E. McElyea.

Three (3) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded. This scholarship is given to students pursuing coursework for a college engineering major.

John A. Spring Award for Excellence Presented by the Western Catholic Union

This award is to be used for tuition at Quincy Notre Dame High School for his or her senior year. The purpose of the award is to recognize the behavioral, educational, and leadership skills that best exemplify the Catholic educational values that have been developed and supported through the leadership of long-time QND Development Executive Director, Mr. John Spring.

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded.

Judy and Rick Haugh Merit Scholarship

This scholarship is being established by Judy and Rick Haugh as a part of their long time support of Quincy Notre Dame. It is their wish that deserving students be assisted financially as they pursue their studies at QND. Judy and Rick have been instrumental in establishing two other QND scholarships that are need based.

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded. This scholarship is to be merit based and is intended to recognize the achievements of the recipient as described in the criteria below.

Applicant Qualifications:

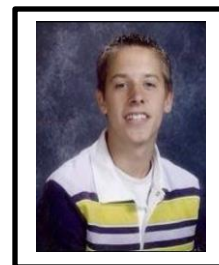
- 1) Student must have a B average.
- 2) Student must document 25 volunteer hours during 11th grade year.
- 3) Student must participate in a minimum of 3 extracurricular activities, one of which may be an athletic program.
- 4) Student must write an essay on the “Value of Catholic Education” to the Haugh family.
- 5) Families of applicants MUST be a participant in the Gene Grawe Fund program.

For Current Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors to be used for QND tuition:

Mark A. Bocke Scholarship

The intent of the Mark A. Bocke Scholarship is to assist one QND student each year with financial need. Recipients are to exhibit the joyful and active spirit of Mark and the pride he held for his friends, his activities and Quincy Notre Dame High School.



Two (2) \$500 scholarships will be awarded.

Charles R. and Carolyn A. Briddle Scholarship

Charles and his wife, Carolyn, raised eight children and all graduated from QND. They truly appreciated the support given to their family throughout the many years of the high school education process. Therefore, they want to provide financial assistance to a QND student each year.

All applicants must have submitted the financial aid paperwork through the FACTS process to be eligible.

One (1) \$365 scholarship will be awarded.

Luke A. Mayfield Scholarship

Luke was a 2012 graduate of Quincy Notre Dame. He was a vivacious and spirited young man who simply loved QND where he considered the school his 2nd home. Luke truly felt touched by the staff, students, coaches, and his peers. At QND was where Luke's faith truly blossomed. Luke was involved in TEC, CHWC, and Quest to name a few. The goal of this scholarship is to continue to keep Luke's memory alive and well throughout the halls of QND.



One (1) \$350 scholarship will be awarded.

The Mayfield family seeks to support a QND student through the scholarship who meet some of these below qualities:

- 1) A student who is nature driven, is a steward of resources and has an interest in the area of conservation.
- 2) Someone who has an active church affiliation regardless of a particular faith. They could also serve as a Eucharistic Minister.
- 3) Someone who is active in volunteering in our community through service. A good example would be such activities such as Give Kids a Smile.
- 4) A student who has an interest in scouting and may be working on an Eagle Scout.
- 5) A student who is involved in leadership activities at QND such as Student Council.
- 6) A student who has a demonstrated financial need and has completed the FACTS financial assistance paperwork.

Brett A. Miller Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is honoring the passion, determination and strength that Brett illustrated to everyone in how he lived his life. 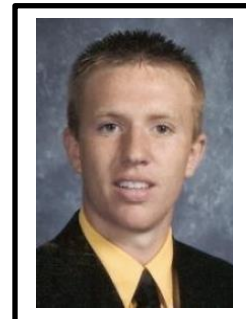
One (1) \$850 scholarship will be awarded.

An application will be utilized with the following criteria:

- 1) The student must demonstrate a financial need for this scholarship as determined through the FACTS process.
- 2) The student should maintain at least a C Average in school and have a good attendance record.

Kyle David Russell Scholarship

This scholarship was set up to memorialize Kyle in a way that would allow future QND students to benefit from Kyle's memory. Kyle was a 2004 graduate of QND and served as co-captain on the boys' soccer team. Kyle lost a courageous battle with leukemia in December 2009.



Criteria for consideration for this scholarship include but are not limited to school spirit, a strong moral character, and someone who is always willing to listen and help anyone just as Kyle did.

One (1) \$325 scholarship will be awarded.

Bob & Judy Winking Scholarship

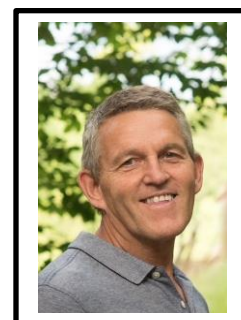

Martin (Marty) Peters Scholarship

This scholarship was started as a way to honor the life and legacy of Marty Peters. Marty was a 1975 graduate of Quincy Notre Dame. Marty was a well-known and respected business leader in the Quincy community. Marty focused his life on his family and business. He was co-owner of Peters Heating & Air Conditioning and a kind, generous hard-working soul who always put others before himself.



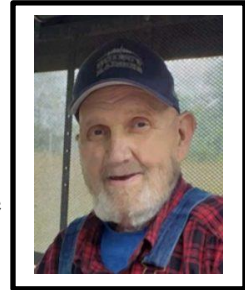
The intent is to provide financial assistance to students and families aspiring to attend QND, just as Marty would have wanted.
