Quincy Notre Dame Foundation Reaches Milestone

As the cost of education continues to rise, it is imperative for Catholic schools to continually assess ways to offset tuition. The most important component of the Quincy Notre Dame Foundation is to provide an affordable education for QND students and families. The QND joint finance committee, composed of the school and foundation board executive committees, work hard to leverage all angles to ensure tuition increases are minimal.

Since 1968, the QND Foundation has focused on raising funds that could be invested with the dividends benefitting the school for financial aid. The QND Foundation has worked with the Foundation Board of Directors to craft and manage an investment policy that directly benefits QND. One of those aspects is the QND scholarship portfolio.

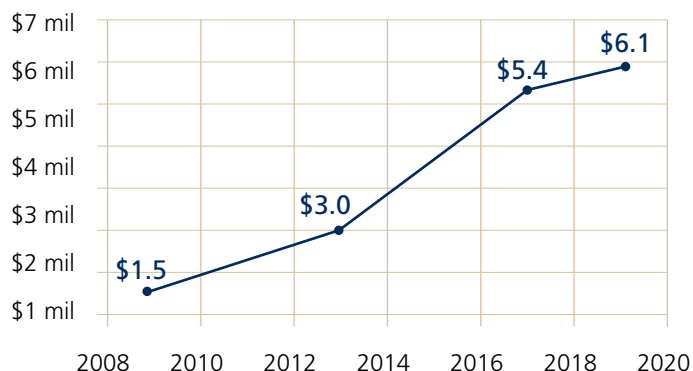
The QND Foundation has seen a tremendous increase with individual, family and class scholarships in the last ten years. In fact, over 65 new scholarships have been added to the portfolio with over 300% growth since 2009. The scholarship portfolio currently sits over \$6.1 million.

“We are thrilled to see the growth of our scholarship portfolio,” said Kurt Stuckman, QND Foundation executive director. “It shows that our constituents want to leave a lasting legacy with QND by making a difference in the lives of numerous QND families.”

The QND Foundation currently manages over 145 scholarships. More than \$230,000 in financial assistance was awarded to 35% of QND students for the 2019-2020 school year.

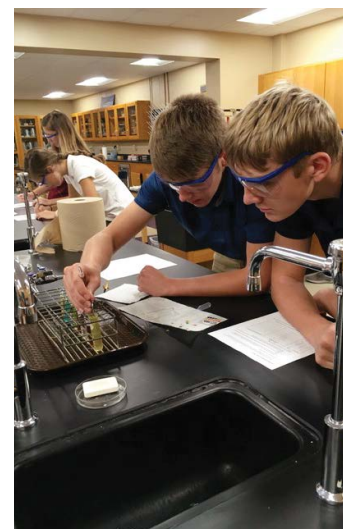


QND Foundation Scholarship Portfolio Growth

Passing the Torch



Two pillars of Quincy Notre Dame said goodbye following the 2018-19 school year after a combined 56 years of service to QND. Former English teacher Susan (Howell) Schmitz *left*, and guidance counselor Judy Liesen '71 *right* are both enjoying their recent retirements.

Mrs. Susan Schmitz began her time at QND in 1982, left in 2000 when she was expecting her daughter and returned in 2006. Along with English, Mrs. Schmitz taught religion, consumer economics, government, world history, psychology, sociology, and speech over the years. She was also the junior class moderator for many years, girls tennis coach for a short time, and drama club and natural helpers moderator. Mrs. Schmitz coached the QND Quiz Bowl team for nearly 25 years and led the team to a fourth place finish at the IHSA Class A Scholastic Bowl in 2013. She is still coaching the QND Quiz Bowl team this school year.

"QND became part of my family. I find my 'QND Family' everywhere I go in Quincy and sometimes when I travel,"

stated Mrs. Schmitz. "My life has been enriched by the friendships that have developed with families, students and QND staff. Accepting the teaching job at QND in 1982 was one of the best decisions I've ever made."

Judy Liesen began working part time at QND in 1994 as a freshman guidance counselor and was hired full time her second year and was assigned responsibilities of the sophomore class as well. Ten years later with the retirement of colleague Bill Bucklew, Mrs. Liesen became the junior and senior counselor. She served in this capacity for her remaining 15 years. She's assisted many students in choosing colleges or other post high school plans, served as a social and emotional counselor, administered many standardized tests, written numerous recommendation letters,

and helped foreign exchange students with admissions and adjustment to attending school in the USA.

Mrs. Liesen remains connected to QND as a substitute teacher this school year.

"I truly enjoyed my time at QND and considered it more of a mission than a job. The faculty and staff were wonderful to work with," said Mrs. Liesen. "The most rewarding thing for me is seeing former students years later and catching up on what is happening in their lives and learning about their families and careers."
