## New Student Leadership Opportunities at QND

Quincy Notre Dame has adopted

the House System beginning with the 2021-22 school year to build closer community relationships within the school. This student-based leadership program has two student House Captains that help guide 32 student House Leaders. Meeting weekly, each House is comprised of two House Leaders, approximately 25

students in grades 9 through 12, as well as an adult mentor. Four Houses make up one Community. Currently we have four Communities: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

House activities are led by two student House Leaders, a junior and a senior, and focus on team building, faith formation and other activities. "The best part of the House System is being able to learn about the students in my house and

having the amazing opportunity to connect with them," states Senior House Captain Kaitlyn Smith. "I also enjoy growing as a leader and working with schoolmates and staff."

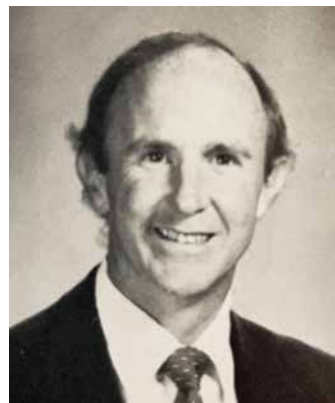

## QND Fund Drive Makes History *continued*

“We worked very hard to ensure no stone was left unturned. We networked with many businesses, individuals, families and alumni throughout the country to support the importance of Catholic secondary education in Quincy,” said Stuckman. “The success is great, but more importantly, we are very humbled that so many supporters put their faith in us to invest in our school wisely which enables QND to remain the debt free school that it is.”

The QND Fund Drive keeps tuition affordable by paying a portion of the school’s operating expenses to close the gap between the cost to educate and student tuition. The campaign also provides financial assistance to students. Over the past 44 years, the QND Fund Drive has raised more than \$17 million. The Fund Drive was led by co-chairpersons Bryan Stokes and Lydia (Keck) Miller '04.

### Highlights of the 2021 QND Fund Drive:

- The Foundation received more than \$61,000 in new gifts and collected over \$70,000 from donors who increased their gift from the previous year.
- The 2021 Fund Drive saw 66% of all gifts come from alumni.
- The average gift to the 2021 Fund Drive was \$439.
- The success comes from a donor retention rate of 92% year after year.

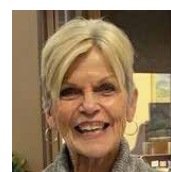

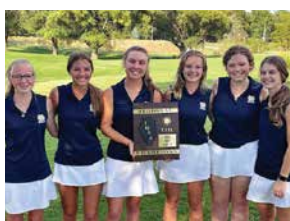

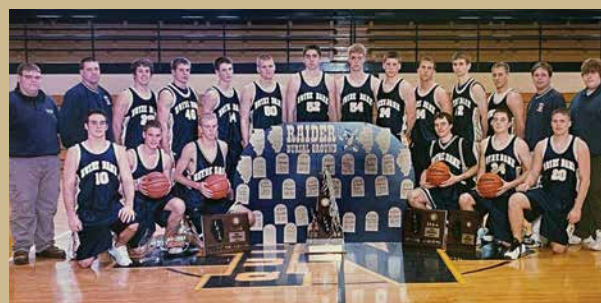

## Message from Executive Director

The QND Foundation, with your support, was able to navigate through a very successful Fund Drive, Mega Raffle, golf fundraiser and more. Our ability to help the high school and assist our students and families would not be possible without the generosity of our benefactors.

The QND Fund Drive had a tremendous banner year raising \$571,000 on a goal of \$447,500. This is the largest amount raised in the 44-year history of the Fund Drive. The 2021 Mega Raffle sold all 4,000 tickets in three weeks and provided \$100,000 to the QND and QCES (Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools) Foundations. The raffle additionally, through the \$10 Ticket Give-Back program, awarded a total of \$40,000 amongst Quincy's five Catholic schools.

We have seen tremendous growth in our scholarship portfolio that is valued over \$7.3M, up from \$1.8M just 10 short years ago. We currently provide more tuition assistance than ever before to our students at more than \$300,000 annually. The Foundation

supports the school in a variety of ways for the benefit of our students. In addition to financial aid, the Foundation invests over \$800,000 annually into the high school.

We recently assisted in launching the "Score One for the Kids" Campaign, which raised funds to replace the large outdated scoreboard located on the west wall in "The Pit." The campaign was a huge success, and we are currently under contract to install the new digital scoreboard this spring.

Your unwavering support and prayers enable us to make a tremendous difference in the lives of our future leaders – and for that I am very grateful. Thank you for continuing to believe in us and trusting us to put your hard-earned dollars to work for the students of QND. We look forward to more success and what lies ahead in 2022!
