The Fund Drive keeps tuition affordable by paying a portion of the school's operating expenses to close the gap between the cost to educate and student tuition. It also provides tuition assistance to students. Currently, 35% of the OND student body receives financial assistance. The 2022 Fund Drive was led by co-chairpersons Lydia Miller '04 and Scott Smith.

CATHOLIC HEART WORKCAMP



For more than 20 years, Quincy Notre Dame has participated in Catholic Heart Workcamp (CHWC). Founded in 1993, CHWC offers youth-friendly short term mission trips. This national organization offers students the opportunity to grow in their faith while serving others. Throughout the years, QND has traveled all across the country to states such as Florida, Montana, Colorado, Texas and Connecticut.

QND students and chaperones volunteer for one week in the summer to take this mission trip where they spend their days serving the community by helping with anything from yard clean-up, painting, helping non-profits, working with

children, and more. "The impact CHWC makes on our students, particularly the interaction they have with the people they are serving face-to-face, makes it one of our most important ministry offerings each year," stated QND Director of Christian Formation Mike Young '98.

During the times they are not working, students participate in activities that challenge them to grow in their faith in an engaging, dynamic way. "The morning and evening programs allowed me to grow in my faith in a way I had never experienced before," said QND senior Ada Kurk. "Many opportunities are offered throughout the week such as Mass, Confession, and even Adoration."

Another unique aspect of CHWC is that students meet and interact daily with students from across the nation also attending the workcamp. Many of the friendships made last longer than that week and can last a lifetime.

Kurk continued, "It is such a neat experience to see teenagers from all over serving and worshiping together in one place." CHWC truly is an opportunity like no other.

In 1984 she received her master's degree in international education and in 1991 she earned her doctorate.

She went on to become an associate professor and director of study abroad at Notre Dame of Maryland University and later, 2002-2011, was the School Sisters of Notre Dame representative to the United

Nations' Department of Public Information (DPI) and the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) in New York. From 2011 to 2022. Sr. Ann served as the associate director for social mission at the Leadership Conference of Women Religious in Silver Spring, Maryland. Sr. Ann celebrated her 50th Jubilee in the summer of 2022.

"My life in SSND has been filled with adventures and countless blessings," Sr. Ann continues. "The opportunities provided by rich and varied ministries opened my heart to a world longing for meaning and hungry for justice. It has been a gift to be able to journey with my SSND sisters around the world as together we seek to build God's beloved community."

Sr. Ann is the eldest of Charles and Nancy Scholz's seven children and boasts numerous nieces, nephews and grand nieces and nephews.



Timothy L. Haley '09 Scholarship



Adopt-a-Student Program

The Adopt-a-Student program raises funds to directly assist families who have tuition assistance needs above and beyond what was awarded through QND's financial assistance scholarship program. This program is managed by the QND Foundation and offers

the opportunity for donors to provide financial assistance to students who may not have the chance to attend QND without their support.

This year, several QND families have experienced extraordinary financial challenges. The QND Foundation recently set a goal to raise \$50,000 for this program to replenish and build funds and ensure they can continue assisting families with tuition needs in the future. Every child should have the opportunity to be educated in a faith-filled environment and tuition costs should not be a deterrent.
