In collaboration with the Tracy Family Foundation and Partners in Mission, Quincy Notre Dame launched a long-range strategic plan in November to shape the future of QND. Partners in Mission will guide objectives, timelines, data aggregation and analysis.

This opportunity allows QND to evaluate its current level of success to plan for a brighter future. As school leaders, it's essential to hear from constituents to meet the needs of the students and families served.

This process will enable QND to establish goals in eight domains: Academics, Advancement, Catholic Identity, Enrollment, Facilities, Finance, Governance, and Student Life. A current member of the QND Board of Directors leads each domain. Domain chairs will guide this process with QND staff members and the long-range strategic planning steering committee. Their work will also include gathering input from students, parents, alumni, and community members.

QND's tradition is over 156 years strong! The goal is simple – create and implement a visionary plan that charts the course for the school's continued growth and success. Doing so will foster a vibrant future that remains focused on its mission, which states, "Founded on Catholic values, Quincy Notre Dame High School educates lifelong learners for lives of service."

The goal is to have the new strategic plan confirmed by June 2024 and implemented over the next several years.

Alumni Spotlight



John Cook '65

John Cook graduated from Christian Brothers High School in 1965. He attended the University of Illinois, earned a bachelor's in Engineering Physics, and attended grad school at U of I in Nuclear Engineering. John completed his master's and was working

toward a Ph.D. when the Vietnam War disrupted his plans. He signed up for the U.S. Naval Officer Candidate School (OCS). While at OCS, he was selected to be an instructor at the U.S. Naval Nuclear Power School (NPS), teaching officers and enlisted men about the operation of nuclear reactors aboard ships and submarines. While teaching at NPS, he attended night school at Golden University and received an MBA.

After four years in the Navy, John and his wife returned to Illinois, and he started working at the Clinton Nuclear

Power Plant. He later worked at the Bruce Nuclear Plant in Ontario, Canada, advising plant managers on the safe operation of the four reactors there. They then moved in 2000 to Vienna, Austria, where he served as Senior Nuclear Safety Officer with a United Nations Organization, the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA). He organized and led international teams of nuclear experts on safety inspections of nuclear power plants worldwide. After five years, they returned to Central Illinois, and he continued consulting in nuclear safety.

"The brothers at CBHS were an inspiration to me. Throughout my work, I enjoyed the wonderful and interesting people I met. I also appreciated that I was doing something to promote peace and safety," states John. "In 2005, my last year with the IAEA, the IAEA organization was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize."

After many years of living near Maroa, Ill., John and his wife Margie (Wisman) '65 moved to Florida in 2019. They have three children and seven grandchildren.

As an aerospace engineer, John's group designs flight software for communications satellites, particularly the software responsible for allowing the satellite to operate

autonomously with minimal interaction from the customer operators on Earth. After living in Los Angeles for 10 years, John and his family moved back to Quincy, and he has been working remotely for the past 18 years. John states, "The part of my job that I enjoy the most is when our satellites are launched into orbit when I travel back to L.A., and we perform deployments and test the satellite in orbit from our

mission control center before handing it over to the customer for operations."

John and his wife Sara (Ebbing) '92 reside in Quincy and have been married for 26 years. They have two sons, Colby '19 and Braden '23, and one daughter, Avery, a junior at QND. "I feel QND did a great job preparing me and my wife for college and has done the same for our children."

Hilary Obert enjoys working in a high-paced, competitive, and ambiguous environment as a Team Physical Therapist at Seattle Sounders Football Club in Seattle, Wash. After graduating from QND in 2009, Hilary attended Saint Louis University and received her Bachelor's in Exercise Science and Doctorate in Physical Therapy. She then completed the MVP Physical Therapy Sports Residency Program in Seattle.

As a Team Physical Therapist for the Seattle Sounders, Hilary contributes and manages team

activation sequences, daily manual therapy and treatment prep for first-team players, and manages gym phase rehab for injured athletes. "I get to work with elite athletes, day in and day out, where I can work to keep players available for selection and healthy," states Hilary. "To some, they see it as just a game, but this is many of the players' livelihood, how they feed and support their families. Working in a sport like soccer, I am able to interact and meet people from all walks of life and come into contact with people from many different countries and cultures. Winning the MLS Cup in 2019, celebrating with my

sister and brother-in-law, and watching an injured player return from an ACL surgery are memories that will last a lifetime."

Hilary has six siblings, all QND graduates, and is the daughter of John '80 and Michelle (Peters) '81 Obert. She credits her time at QND as a big part of her successes. "Life at QND impacted my life both professionally and personally. I learned the importance of competition and hard work from an early age," says Hilary. "Whether watching the older Lady Raiders for years as an adolescent or competing myself, I learned what it meant to lose, what it meant to



fail, and how to create goals and work hard to achieve them. Playing alongside my friends and sisters and having the support of my parents, grandparents, and younger siblings was an awesome experience. Quincy Notre Dame will always be home."





As we reflect on the past year, we are encouraged that we celebrated many positive events. One of our biggest successes of 2023 was the QND Fund Drive, the most important fundraiser of Quincy Notre Dame.

Another celebration of success is the continued growth of our alumni support through class scholarships. These scholarships are a collective way for an entire class to pay it forward to the next generation. In 2010, the QND Foundation had 10 class scholarships valued at \$65,000. Fast-forward to 2023, the Foundation manages over 25 class scholarships valued at over \$458,000.

It takes \$10,000 to establish a class scholarship, and the largest monetary valued class scholarship is the Class of 1964, followed by the Class of 1971 and 1981. With your continued support and investment in the students of Quincy Notre Dame, we can continue to make a difference by keeping a QND education as affordable as possible.

Scholarship Highlight: Richard K. Reis Scholarship

The Richard K. Reis Scholarship was started in 2021 to honor the life and legacy of QND legend Rich Reis. Rich was the head of maintenance at QND from 1980 until his retirement in 2018. This is a special scholarship, not only because of the man behind it but because it is the first-ever trade scholarship at QND. Rich recognized that the trades are vital to our community and felt giving students the opportunity to go into the trades was important. Rich's family decided to begin this scholarship to honor and give back to the students who meant so much to him and to carry on his legacy.

"QND was like family to our dad. He built many lasting relationships with people that he met through QND. Both of his sons, Randy '89 and Richie '89, as well as two grandsons, Andrew '13 and Evan '18, graduated from QND. It was a very special place to all of them. Rich was a talented person, a jack of all trades, and a master of many. He was a hard worker and instilled that in his children and grandchildren. He gave his time, talent, and treasure to many people and organizations during his lifetime. QND Fund Drive Success

On October 20, 2023, the Quincy Notre Dame Foundation announced that the 2023 QND Fund Drive raised \$560,832 in gifts and pledges, exceeding its goal by more than \$90,000.

The QND Fund Drive keeps tuition affordable by paying a portion of the school's operating expenses to close the gap between the cost to educate and student tuition. The campaign also provides financial assistance to students. Over the past 46 years, the Fund Drive has raised more than \$18 million. The drive was led by co-chairpersons Scott Smith and Brian Dreier '89.

"The QND Fund Drive is critical to our students' successful, faith-based education," said Brian Dreier. "Through the generosity of our donors, we help ensure that QND and its students will have a bright future ahead."
