Greatest Fund Drive Success in School History

The Quincy Notre Dame Foundation announced that the 2024 QND Fund Drive raised \$607,370 in gifts and pledges, surpassing its goal by more than \$132,000. This remarkable achievement marks the largest amount ever raised since the Fund Drive began in 1977. The effort was led by co-chairpersons Brian Dreier '89 and Dr. Jason Knuffman '93. "The QND Fund Drive continues to be our most important annual fundraiser. The historic support we received this year is a testament to the education



that QND provides," stated Kurt Stuckman, executive director of the QND Foundation. "Supporters from all over the country made the conscious choice to invest in our school, and we are very grateful."

The QND Fund Drive keeps tuition affordable by paying a portion of the

school's operating expenses to close the gap between the cost to educate and student tuition. The campaign also provides financial assistance to students. Over the past 47 years, the QND Fund Drive has raised more than \$18.5 million.

FUND DRIVE HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Foundation received over \$17,000 in new gifts and collected over \$59,000 from donors who increased their gifts from the previous year.
- The 2024 Fund Drive saw 69% of all gifts come from alums.
- There were 166 donors who were part of the Ray Heilmann Legacy Society (gifts of \$1,000 and above).



New College Opportunity for QND Students

QND is committed to investing in the future of its students by partnering with VU Scholarships, an online platform that informs students about scholarship opportunities at two-year and four-year institutions across the country.

Junior and senior student data (GPA and class rank) is uploaded to the VU Scholarships system. Each student has a profile on the system, and based on the established information from the colleges, this system will display scholarship opportunities they could qualify for at the institutions.



In October 2024, QND counselor Bob Sheffield announced that juniors and seniors at QND could be eligible for more than \$359 million in scholarships available from various colleges nationwide. This is an incredible achievement for QND students and highlights scholarship opportunities they may not have been aware of before.



SENIOR SUNRISE

The Class of 2025 began a new tradition called Senior Sunrise to kick off the school year. Seniors arrived at 5:30 a.m., the first Friday of school, to set up and grill breakfast. Students enjoyed food, fellowship, and music with their classmates in anticipation of their final year of high school.



QND is excited to welcome **FR. PAUL LESUPATI** as a co-chaplain along with Fr. Leo Enlow. Fr. Paul is the Parochial Vicar at St. Peter Church in Quincy. He has been a blessing to the QND students and staff with his infectious laugh and jovial personality.



QND recently held its 3rd annual **CONSTRUCTION** event, where each house contributed food items to create a unique structure. The 2024 Food Drive raised over \$8,000 to purchase these non-perishable food items to benefit Quincy Catholic Charities.

LONG-RANGE STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

Over the past 15 months, QND staff, board members, key community stakeholders, and student leaders have been working diligently to shape the school's future. In collaboration with the Tracy Family Foundation and Partners in Mission, QND developed a comprehensive long-range strategic plan. This process evaluated eight key areas: Academics, Advancement, Catholic Identity, Enrollment, Facilities, Finance, Governance, and Student Life.

Several objectives emerged from this initiative, including assessing course offerings, building strategic local alliances, deepening and growing the school's Catholic identity, clearly articulating its value proposition, ensuring sustainable cash flow and reserves, fostering stronger student connections to enhance community, and establishing a governance framework.

These priorities, along with many others, will be reviewed, researched, and addressed at the committee level over the next three to five years.

Rick Gengenbacher '84

Rick graduated from QND in 1984, attended John Wood Community College, and received his Bachelor of Science from Culver-Stockton College. While at Culver-Stockton, Rick was a student worker at the Illinois Veterans Home in Quincy and joined the Illinois National Guard, serving eight years and earning an officer's commission.

Rick went on to work for the Veterans Home for 36 years before retiring in 2023 and was proud to serve those who served our country. At his retirement, Rick was serving as the Home's adjutant, supervising the admission process and several departments, including activities/volunteer services, chaplains, social services, housekeeping, and laundry. He also oversaw the employee appreciation program, planned all special events such as Memorial Day and Veterans Day programs, served as editor of the Home's publication, *The Bugle*, and the in-house television station. Before serving as adjutant, Rick served as director of marketing and public information officer.

Post-retirement, Rick continues to volunteer at the Veterans Home, stays active at his parish, officiates high school

basketball for the IHSA and MSHSAA, and serves on several community boards. Rick remains invested in QND, where he coaches the junior high softball team, is a substitute teacher, and continues to cook at the QND Pancake and Sausage Breakfast with his brothers.

Of all these undertakings, Rick's favorite activity is being a grandparent. He and his wife Becky have four daughters, all graduates of QND, and seven grandchildren, with one on the way.

Rick admits that his high school years were challenging, but looking back, he is thankful his parents were committed to having their seven children, of which Rick is the oldest, receive a Catholic education at QND. “While I was oblivious to it at the moment, the tough times built character, and I wouldn't change any of it. Those struggles and my QND Catholic education are a big part of who I am today,” states Rick.

Students Thrive in CEO Program



The Adams County CEO (Creating Entrepreneurial Opportunities) program was established in the fall of 2023 to create experimental learning opportunities for students. It is a part of the national network of CEO chapters. Through the program, students gain firsthand entrepreneurial education from local businesses and community leaders.

Applications for the class are submitted to a committee of Adams County CEO Board Members. This school year, six seniors from QND are participating, along with 14 other seniors from high schools across Adams County. These students meet daily throughout the school year at John Wood Community College.

"The CEO Program provides a unique opportunity for us to gain real-world experience," QND senior Daniel Strudwick states. "I love meeting business

owners and hearing their stories; this program allows me to do just that."

During the first semester, students collaborate on a class business, and in the second semester, each student develops their own business. They also visit local businesses and meet with a mentor who assists them through the process of creating their own business. Ultimately, the CEO program aims to provide students with real-life experiences, foster business relationships, and build future leaders for our communities.

"Quincy Notre Dame is blessed to have a number of students involved in the CEO program," said QND Principal Mark McDowell. "Students gain authentic knowledge through their engagement with local businesses in Adams County. We believe those experiences will translate into success beyond high school."

Tom McElyea '68

Tom credits the extracurriculars he was involved in at Christian Brothers to his success as an engineer. "While at CB, I held leadership roles in several clubs, including Key Club Treasurer and Science Club President," says Tom. "These positions gave me the chance to work with others in group discussions and meetings that later benefited me in engineering management positions."

Tom graduated from Christian Brothers in 1968 and attended the University of Missouri at Rolla, earning a bachelor's

degree in mechanical engineering. After graduation in 1972, Tom worked for Texaco at its oil refinery in Port Arthur, Texas, while working to achieve his Master of Engineering degree from Lamar University.

Tom worked for Jacobs Engineering, a consulting engineering firm, for 16 years in Texas. He held the positions of project manager and manager of the mechanical engineering department. He worked on engineering and construction projects for chemical plants and oil refineries along the

Gulf Coast of Texas, Louisiana, and Mississippi.

Tom then moved on and became director of engineering for Sid Richardson Carbon and Energy company in Fort Worth, Texas. He led engineering and construction projects for natural gas processing plants in Texas and New Mexico and carbon black plants in Texas and Louisiana. After 22 years at Sid, Tom retired in 2013 and lives in Fort Worth.

During his career, Tom became a licensed professional engineer in Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, New Mexico, and West Virginia.



"The Brothers and lay teachers maintained a disciplined and respectful atmosphere for everyone at Christian Brothers," says Tom. "I had excellent math teachers throughout my four years. Everyone helped me develop relationships to work with people from different backgrounds."

In Memory of John Spring



The QND community mourns the loss of the legendary John Spring, who passed away on December 2, 2024. John began his teaching and coaching career at Quincy Notre Dame in 1976. During that school year, he was appointed as the first full-time executive director of the QND Foundation, a title he held for 29 years.

In 1977, John launched the inaugural QND Fund Drive to raise money for the school. Since its inception, the Fund Drive has raised over \$18.5 million. John left QND in 2005 and went on to serve two terms as the mayor of Quincy.

At the time of his passing, John was a Life Director on the QND Foundation Board and held the position of Secretary of the QND Athletic Hall of Fame. He was also inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2018 in recognition of his outstanding service.

John was a passionate advocate for Catholic education in Quincy. The success of Quincy Notre Dame High School and the Quincy Notre Dame Foundation can be largely attributed to John's visionary leadership. His impact on QND and the entire Quincy community was profound. John was a kind, faithful, and compassionate man who dearly loved his family, QND, and the city of Quincy.
